7 GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are, according to Catholic Tradition, wisdom, understanding, council, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of God. The standard interpretation has been the one that St. Thomas Aquinas worked out in the thirteenth century in his Summa Theologiae.

- ➤ **Wisdom** is both the knowledge of and judgement about "divine things" and the ability to judge and direct human affairs according to divine truth.
- ➤ Understanding is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our eternal salvation in effect, the ability to "see" God.
- ➤ Council allows a man to be directed by God in matters necessary for his salvation.
- ➤ Fortitude denotes a firmness of mind in doing good and in avoiding evil, particularly when it is difficult or dangerous to do so, and the confidence to overcome all obstacles, even deadly ones, by virtue of the assurance of everlasting life.
- Knowledge is the ability to ju8dge correctly about matters of faith and right action, so as to never wander from the straight path of justice.
- ➤ **Piety** is, principally, revering God with filial affection, paying worship and duty to God, paying due duty to all men on account of their relationship to God, and honoring the saints and not contradicting Scripture. The Latin word pietas denotes the reverence that we give to our father and to our country; since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety.
- Fear of God is, in this context, "filial" or chaste fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from him as opposed to "servile" fear, whereby we fear punishment.

Come HOLY SPIRIT Renew The Face of the Earth!

If we turn for a moment to the child's catechism and think what the "gifts and fruits" of the Holy Spirit listed there are, we can see at once why the inflowing of the Spirit of God gives joy to men even in the midst of suffering and hardship: peace, patience, fortitude, wisdom, understanding, joy itself! Or turn to the lovely hymn for the feast of Pentecost to see what the Holy Spirit is to man, and what the descent of the Holy Spirit into his soul does to him.

He is the comforter, that is the one who makes strong; he is rest in toil, shade and refreshment in the heat of noon, solace in grief. He is the light of our life, the light that shines in our darkness. It is the Holy Spirit, so this hymn goes on to tell us, who washes away the stains of our sins; the exquisite quality of water recurs again and again, to quench our thirst; "the pilgrims sweet relief" to wash away our stains of sin, and to "water from heaven our barren clay" - to come down into the dried up, arid life and water it as the blessed rain waters the parched earth, giving life to the seed in it, causing a new spring to break from it in all its cool and overflowing loveliness of green bud and leaf. In our souls this is a new springtide of Christ, an answer to the age-long prayer: Let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior (Is 45:8).

And not only does the Holy Spirit wash the stains from our souls and our minds, but he heals the wounds and bruises of life, he softens the pride that is so often the major cause of our unhappiness, and bows our "stiff necks" to the yoke that is sweet and brings us peace. He warms the hearts that had grown cold and makes them human again, tender to one another, loving towards God, capable once again of bringing more to the measure of love, which is the hope of the world. He recalls us to the Source to drink, to the Source of our life and joy, and all this is not simply to brace us for conquest and to enable us to suffer here, it is to flood all suffering here with joy, and finally to flood death itself with peace and to bring us to the final realization of joy which will never end.
