Saint of the Week: Sts. Simon and Jude, Apostles

Feastday: 10/28



The Church honors Saints Simon and Jude, two of the Twelve Apostles chosen by our Lord. They were two of the first bishops through whom our Lord established His Church and from whom every bishop, priest, and deacon is a spiritual descendant. Today's Simon is not Simon Peter, the Prince of the Apostles, but rather "Simon the Cananean" (Matthew and Mark) and "Simon the Zealot" (Luke and Acts). Both names mean the same thing. "Cananean" does not refer to the Land of Canaan but is a translation of an Aramaic word meaning "zealous." Jude is referred to as "Judas son of James" (Luke and Acts) and "Thaddeus" (Matthew and Mark). The only other reference that is certain about Jude comes from John's Gospel during the Last Supper in which Jude is referred to as "Judas, not the Iscariot..." ([John 14:22](#)).

As we honor these Apostles, what we know for certain is that they were instrumental in the early Church. Being among the first bishops, they bore the sacred responsibility of transmitting the Sacraments and the teachings of Jesus to a nascent Church. One day in Heaven, we will see clearly the effects of their pastoral ministry.

The society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of four Pontifical Mission Societies and the one behind the **World Mission Sunday** efforts, began when a French laywoman, over 200 years ago, answered her brothers' request for prayers for his mission as a priest in Africa. She summoned her friends into prayer groups, asking them to pray daily and give a penny a week to the church in the missions. This collection of pennies became what, in 1926, Pope Pius XI called **World Mission Sunday**. Held each year, this is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young or actively persecuted.

GOSPEL REFLECTION – FR. PETER

"AUTHORITY IS SERVICE"

In the gospel, we see how far the apostles are from the spirit of self-sacrifice. James and John want the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Obviously, they thought that his kingdom would be modeled on worldly kingdoms where those in high places enjoy honor, power, and glory. But Jesus tells them that his disciples are not to imitate the Gentiles, whose rulers lord it over people. In his kingdom, service is what makes one great. He would set the example himself. He came not to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many (a reference to his saving death). Jesus demands that the authorities in his Church must wear the unmistakable livery of service.

James and John were two opportunists. Their one aim was to rise in ranks. To achieve their end, they did not hesitate to beg. They did not mind how much envy and resentment they aroused in their companions. Their aim was to scramble up the career ladder. But at what price to themselves. In the course of their rise to the top, whatever they do or achieve will be worthless. Power hardens the human heart. A hard-hearted person is incapable of love. It is by giving that we receive, and it in serving that we grow in love.
