WEEKLY SPIRITUAL "ETIQUETTE" 4 "DO NOT ALLOW GREED TO CONTROL YOUR HEART"

In today's world, many people spend their whole lives trying to accumulate more money, more land, more possessions, more power. There is nothing wrong with working hard and being financially stable. But if greed controls the heart, a person may end up rich in property yet poor in relationships, peace, and compassion.

A greedy person often asks: **"What can I get?"** But a generous person asks: **"What can I share?"** And strangely enough, generous people may not always become the richest in wealth, but they often become the richest in love, friendship, and respect. People naturally stay close to those who know how to care, listen, and share. **Jesus Himself said: "Give, and gifts will be given to you" (Luke 6:38).**

At the end of life, God will not ask us how many properties we owned, but how many hearts we touched. The most valuable treasures are not the things we keep for ourselves, but the kindness and generosity we share with others.

“HOSPITALITY”

Friends, we are in the house of God. God is the host; we are the guests. We should feel welcome and at home here. God accepts us, therefore we should accept one another. One of the nicest things is to meet an open, friendly, warm, hospitable person. Hospitality is a hallmark of a true follower of Christ. In the first reading **2 Kings 4:8-11. 14-16**, God rewards a beautiful act of hospitality. The reading echoes what the Gospel says about the importance of showing hospitality towards the envoy of God. In the second reading **Roman 6:3-4.8-11**, Paul tells us that through baptism we are united to the life and death of Christ.

And the Gospel of today, **Matthew 10:37-42**, stresses the sacrifices involved in being missionaries of Jesus Christ, and also the greatness of even the smallest act of hospitality offered to those missionaries. Christ urges us to be hospitable. Hospitality to a friend is no big deal. There is no risk involved, and there is every likelihood that the favor will be returned. But hospitality to a stranger is a remarkable thing. You do not owe anything to a stranger, and there is a risk involved. Christ calls us to welcome the stranger in our midst. To be hospitable does not mean making strangers like us. It means accepting them as they are. This enables them to shed off their strangeness and become members of the community. Let us be hospitable.

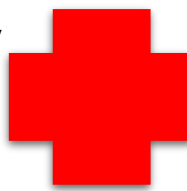
