O truly blessed Night, sings the Exsultet of the Easter Vigil, which alone deserved to know the time and the hour when Christ rose from the realm of the dead! But no one was an eyewitness to Christ's Resurrection and no evangelist describes it. No one can say how it came about physically. Still less was its innermost essence, his passing over to another life, perceptible to the senses. Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still it remains at the very heart of the mystery of faith as something that transcends and surpasses history. This is why the risen Christ does not reveal himself to the world, but to his disciples, "to those who came up with him from Galilee to Jerusalem, who are now his witnesses to the people." CCC647

This year at Steubenville and Franciscan LEAD my faith was completely transformed and kindled anew. I went to LEAD this year, which is a couple day long retreat for youth that are wanting to take that next step further than just the youth conference and deepen their prayer life and faith in God. Going into LEAD I was skeptical and frankly was there because it was my last year, I had the opportunity to go and I didn't want to regret it down the road that I hadn't gone. I was scared that I would be the least Catholic there and to be honest my faith was not in a good place. This little light of mine was starting to burn out and not shine so brightly. When we arrived at LEAD I was so nervous and I really felt as though I didn't belong there and that everyone else had a good handle on their faith and knew God personally. I felt that I didn't know God personally in my life and was frustrated with the relationship I had with my faith. I grew up catholic and going to church was the norm, I never had to make my faith my own because it was something I'd always just had. Go to church, pray my nightly prayers and so on. Over the course of the next few days, I made amazing friendships and built community in faith, something I haven't experienced going to public school. I learned amazing things about God and his love for us.

Then we were asked to write out our witnesses, how God has worked in our lives, and I felt like I had the lamest witness ever. It was from 8th grade, and I wasn't even sure it counted. Although my faith was growing, I felt like I didn't know God, I'd never heard his voice, I'd never had a come to Jesus' moment and it made it hard to dive head first and wholly into the faith. So, on the second to last night, we were doing praise and worship and then we were told that the leaders were going to come around and pray for us. The leader got to me and asked me what I needed prayers for and I told her that I felt I didn't know God and his voice, she told me to repeat "in the name of Jesus I renounce the lie that I don't know God and In the name of Jesus I announce the truth that God is with me" and I repeated it out loud and over and over again and I felt nothing happening so I stopped for just a moment to say God I don't know your voice and in that moment I remembered a memory from so many years ago of me laying in my bed and hearing what I thought was my dad's voice but it couldn't have been because he wasn't home, say "Alice I love you" and then in that moment a sense of calm came over me and I heard in my own thoughts "You do know my voice, you've known my voice" and the tears came cascading down my face because I realized I did know the God who loves us and I have had many small come to Jesus moments over my life though this is my big one.

LEAD taught me many things and gave me the stepping stones to start to take my faith seriously, because of the generosity of our parish I was able to go to an amazing retreat and conference and am now confident in my faith and continuing to deepen my relationship with God as I move off on my own. To wrap this up the one thing I learned that I am taking into my faith journey is our religion is about love, all God asks us to do is love everyone like God loves us. We are not made to judge but made to bring God's love to those who need it. Our religion is a beautiful one built on the firm foundation of love and that makes me so proud to be Catholic.




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
