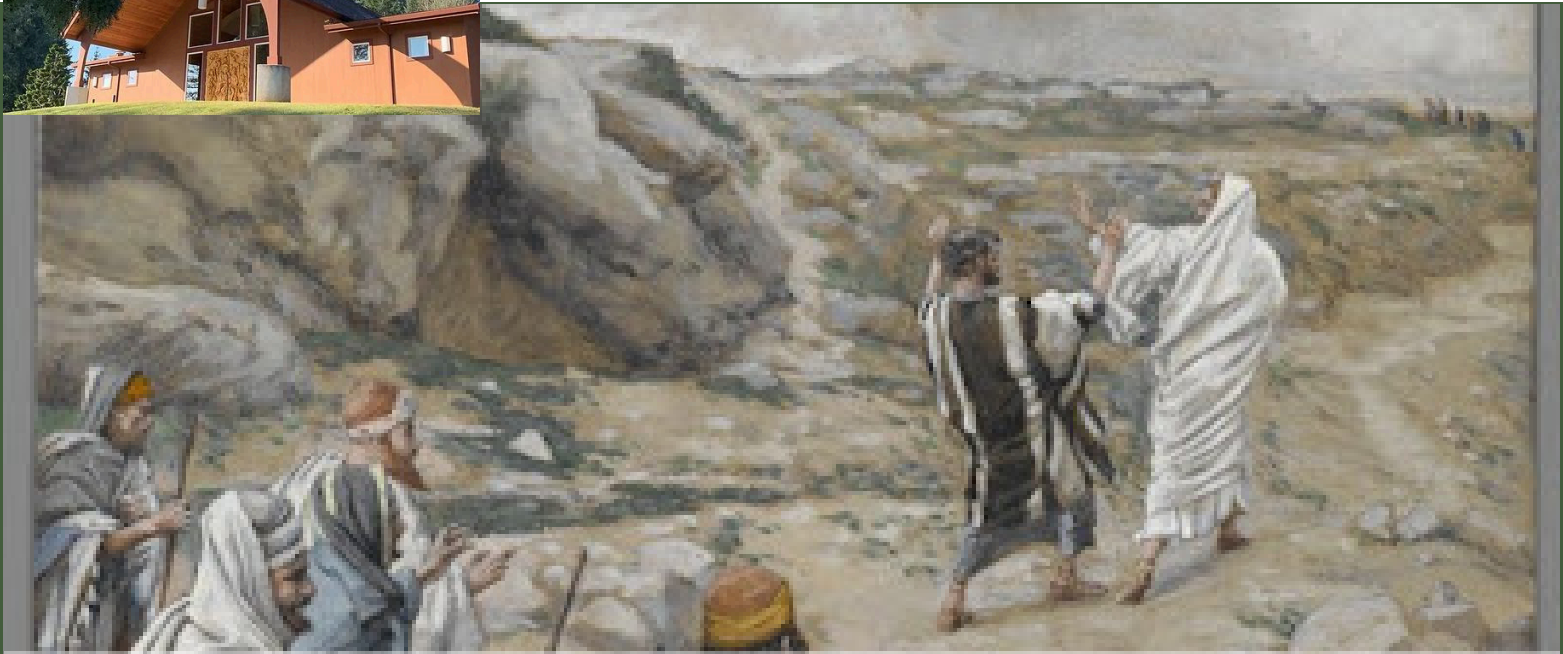

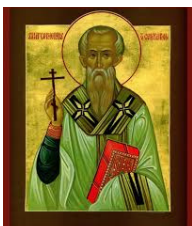

# PRAYER TO STS. CORNELIUS AND CYPRIAN

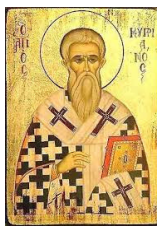
Saints Cornelius and Cyprian, you loved God and remained firm in your faith, even in the face of persecution and death. Your courageous witness was coupled with a pastoral witness to God's mercy. Please pray for me, that I will imitate your courage and merciful hearts, always standing strong in my faith and offering forgiveness to every sinner.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK



StS. Cornelius, Pope and Martyr  
Cyprian, Bishop and Martyr  
Died 253, 258 Feast Day Sept. 16.



St. Cornelius was a Roman priest elected to succeed the martyred St. Fabian as Pope. This election was delayed fourteen months by the persecution of Christians by Emperor Decius and his papacy lasted from 251-253.

Cornelius' pontificate was further complicated by a schism headed by Novatian over the treatment of apostatized Christians or Lapsi. Novatian declared the Church could not forgive the apostates. He therefore declared himself to be Pope. Since his declaration was illegitimate, he became an antipope. Cornelius proclaimed that the Church had the power and authority to offer forgiveness to repentant apostates. He believed the lapsi could be readmitted to the Church after a period offering proper penances. Cornelius was supported against Novatian by St. Cyprian, the bishop of Carthage, as well as many African and Eastern bishops. During a synod of bishops in Rome in October 251, bishops upheld Cornelius in condemning Novatian. Novatian was excommunicated along with his followers.

In 253, the Christian persecution resumed under Emperor Gallus, Cornelius was exiled to Centum Cellae. There he died a martyr most likely as a result of the extreme hardships he suffered.

St. Cyprian was born to a wealthy Carthaginian family and He was baptized in 245 AD at the age of 35. Shortly after he was ordained a deacon and soon afterwards, a priest. He fled Carthage in 250 when the persecutions resumed.

Upon his return, he was aghast to find that priests had been giving the lapsi communion without proper penance. He supported Cornelius against the rigorists in Rome as well as opposed the laxists in Carthage.

In late 256, Emperor Valerian started persecuting Christians and Pope Sixtus II was executed. In Africa, Cyprian prepared his people with De exhortatione martyrii as well as utterly refusing to sacrifice to the pagan dieties and firmly professing Christ. He was banished to Curubis. In 258, he was imprisoned and later executed by Galerius Maximus.
