St. John of God

1495-1550

The life of St. John of God can be best described as impulsive. John lived passionately, and often acted on big life decisions on a whim.

St. John of God was born to a devout Catholic family in Portugal. At the age of 8, John heard a priest speaking about adventures in the Americas. That night, young John decided to run away from home and follow the priest's stories of adventure. John never returned home.

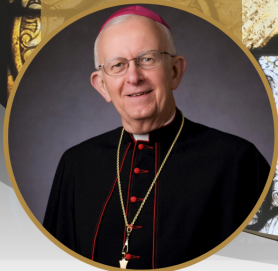
John eventually became a shepherd after traveling from village to village. Around the age of 27, the farmer he worked for wanted John to marry his daughter. Feeling a lot of pressure, John again acted on impulse and left to become a soldier for the Spanish army during the Franco-Spanish War. John was far from the faith until a near death experience as a soldier.

He quickly made a vow to change his life. John amended his life, but still lived a nomadic life. At the age of 38, he moved to Africa to live as a missionary, serving grieving families. John was a great follower of John of Avila, moved by his message of repentance.
